HINTS TO HELP YOU PREPARE FOR THE WEEK:

1. <u>ANY TWO MANUSCRIPTS YOU WISH TO SHOW EDITORS AND PUBLISHERS MAY BE SUBMITTED IN ADVANCE</u> for editorial review or critique/consultation and must be **received in our office no later than March 19**. *Please see our Website at www.mounthermon.org/writers/forms* for the "Advance Manuscript Submission Guidelines" sheet, *Transmittal Forms*. <u>The form that tells what each publicist or editor is looking for or/and willing to critique is posted on the website under "forms"</u>. This should help you decide who you would want to critique or review your work. Please follow the directions carefully.

2. <u>PRE-SUBMITTED MANUSCRIPTS</u> may be retrieved in the Hospitality Center Saturday evening during the conference. Private appointments with editors and faculty members are made by arrangement once here, based on the manuscripts received for review. Other appointments must be made on a space-available arrangement with the individual.

3. <u>WEB BINDER</u>: We will not be handing out binders at the conference. You may find the entire binder on the website March 15th. Download the pages you'd like to have during the conference (workshops, Major Morning Track outline you want to follow), and bring it with you, or download the whole thing on your laptop and bring it all to the conference. Once here there will be several copies of the binder at Hospitality for your perusal should you need it.

4. <u>PLAN TO ARRIVE</u> between 10:00 and 12:00 noon on Friday, March 22. Room keys are available at 10:00. After check-in, visit the Conference Bookstore in Ivy Dining, check out the freebie tables in the back of the Auditorium, or just enjoy the campus. The opening lunch at 12:15 in the Dining Hall will introduce and set the tone for the week. Don't miss it! Introduction of faculty and general orientation follows--an important kick-off to our conference. For first-timers at this conference, there will be an introduction session to give you insight as to how to get the most out of the conference. Alumni will have an orientation and those in the Career Track will have a session as well. <u>We are requesting attendance in your specific orientation so we're all on the same page.</u>

5. <u>BRING BUSINESS CARDS</u> or 3x5 cards with your name, address, phone number, e-mail and any pertinent information. Use these to introduce yourself to editors, publishers, and faculty members during group appointments and consultation times.

6. <u>IT HELPS TO BRING A PORTFOLIO</u> of previously published works. If you're not published, bring samples of your best work to date. Don't forget scripts, speeches (if any).

7. <u>EXTRA THINGS YOU MIGHT WANT TO BRING</u>: A flashlight, rain gear, Bible, laptop, pencils and pens, tote bag, alarm clock, and hiking shoes. Evenings are generally cool, so you will want a jacket or coat. All housing at Mount Hermon includes the provision of linens, including towels and starter soap. You may wish to bring your own big bar of soap, plus extra hangers, extra towel (towels are changed once, mid-conference). No daily maid service on any units. If you're bringing any kind of electric appliance, computer (wireless access available in several places around campus), an extension cord may be needed as well. Some have found a small, high intensity lamp is helpful for inroom study or writing, as most sleeping rooms have only "atmosphere" lighting.

8. <u>DRESS IS CASUAL ALL WEEK</u>. This normally means slacks or jeans. We want you comfortable as you learn. Our campus is hilly with many uneven walkways—wear comfortable footgear.

9. Visa[®] and MasterCard[®] are accepted in 1) the Mount Hermon Book Shop and 2) at our separate Writer's Conference Bookstore in Ivy Dining Room. The Mount Hermon Book Shop carries some clothing items, tapes and

CDs, Bibles, general Christian books, and has a limited sundries section with items you may have forgotten, including toothpaste, aspirin, film, postcards, etc.

10. Registrants who are <u>published book authors may bring their own **pre-priced** books to put on consignment at our Writers Conference Bookstore in Ivy Dining Room for a 20% consignment fee. Look for the special selection of books on writing recommended by the faculty, plus the latest titles authored by faculty and registrants. Books will be sold throughout the week and be available for the Autograph Party honoring all our authors. Note: <u>Please</u> <u>price all books on the BACK cover.</u></u>

11. If you need <u>SHUTTLE ASSISTANCE</u> from the San Jose Airport (we cannot pick up from the San Francisco Airport), please complete the Shuttle Form found at <u>www.mounthermon.org/writers/forms</u>. Print it off and return to the Mount Hermon Registration Office **by March 19**. Because of regulations on passenger pick-up at the San Jose Airport, we must have your flight arrangements by this time. Late changes *only* must be phoned to Bob Hodgson, Transportation Chairman, 928-593-9280, or e-mailed to <u>rachel.williams@mounthermon.org</u> as soon as they are known. The San Jose Airport is a 40-minute drive from Mount Hermon. *Please do NOT show up at the airport without having sent in your shuttle form.*

12. <u>ALL CONFERENCE ALUMNI ARE ELIGIBLE</u> and invited to submit a résumé of their own or a nomination for another writer for the annual Writer of the Year Award, Pacesetter Award, or Special Recognition Award. Detail the nominee's contribution in: (1) articles/stories/poems published; (2) books authored (include publisher & date); (3) classes or workshops taught; (4) speaking engagements; and/or (5) other activities to encourage writers. All nominees must be alumni of the Mount Hermon Christian Writers Conference and be present at this year's conference. All nominations must be postmarked **by March 15**.
