Freelancer, Richmond, VA

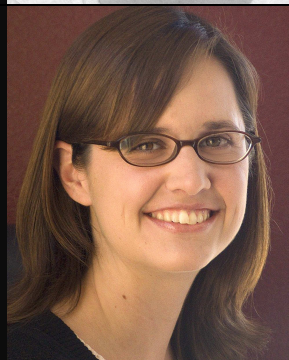

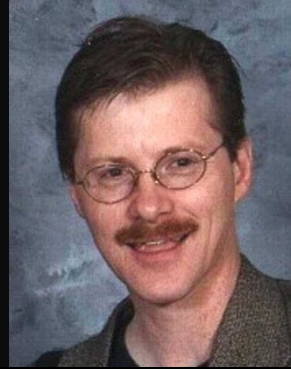

Standard Publishing, Acquisitions Editor, Cincinnati, OH

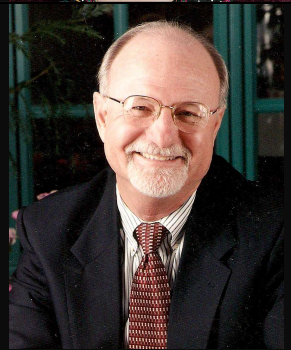

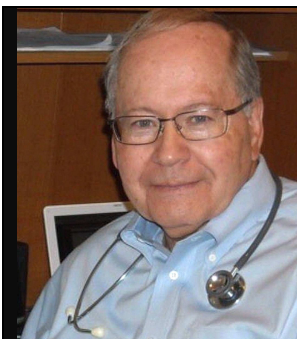


GINGER KOLBABA

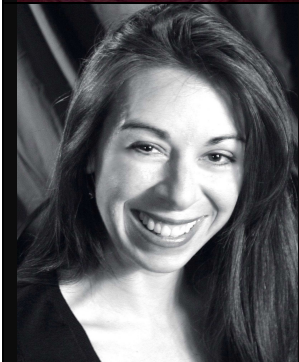


RICK STEELE

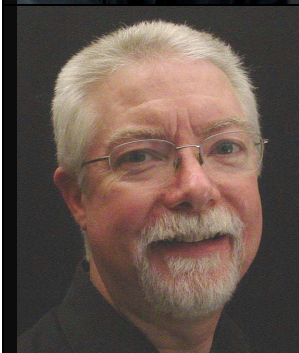


THOMAS UMSTATTD, JR.

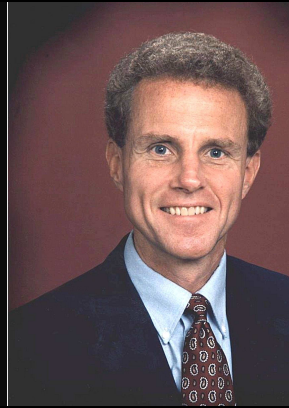

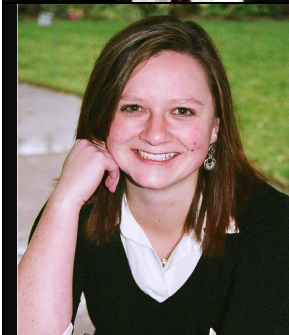
